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


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NEW DELIVERIES

2 NEW ADDITIONS TO STANFORD'S FLEET.



Stanford welcomes two newly built vessels to its existing fleet! The two new additions to Stanford's fleet are **Stanford Mustang** delivered in July 2014 a 50m DP2 Anchor Handling Tug with 69t BP and **Stanford Eagle** a 75m 3300 DWT DP2 Diesel Electric PSV delivered in August 2014.

Stanford Mustang was built specifically for a long term contract with Maersk Oil Qatar, she commenced her long term charter with Maersk Oil replacing Stanford Pride which has been working as a front runner for the contract since early last year. As for Stanford Pride, she is now on a short term charter as Standby Safety Vessel by Maersk.

Our strong chartering performances continue in Q2 and Q3...

To start with, Stanford Buzzard our 87m PSV secured a contract for 2 wells project with Ophir Energy in Tanzania; this will be effective directly after completing her charter with BG Tanzania.

Mubadala Petroleum Thailand awarded "Stanford Mariner 2" a year's contract with further option to extend for another year, after continuing her existing charter with Mubadala that has been ongoing for the past 5 years.

Abu Dhabi was the most active region for us during Q3, taking in 3 of our vessels; Stanford Gold was chartered in by Fugro Survey for 3 months to assist in a survey project with ADMA, Stanford Tyne and Stanford Tigris secured 3 months plus options charter from L&T and NMDC respectively.

Moreover, we have various contracts that were extended for short and long term during these quarters. Dubai Petroleum exercised their options under the ongoing contracts of Stanford Energy, Puma and Sea Robin for another year extending all the contracts until September 2015; noting that Stanford Puma and Sea Robin have been operating with Dubai Petroleum for more than 7 years now.

Stanford Challenger's contract has been extended by Dolphin Energy for 6 months as for Stanford Condor a 4 months extention by L&T.

NMDC extended the contracts of Global King and Stanford Provider by 3 months each, Total E&P Qatar extended Nile for 30 days and indicated their interest to extend the contract till end of the year, and last but not least McDermott continue to extend the contracts of the vessels on charter with them for 2 - 3 months including Maya, Swift, Dove, Ariston and Global Falcon.

Having a positive market outlook, same trend of high utilization is expected to continue for the rest of the year and further.

HEALTH, SAFETY and ENVIRONMENT

A QUICK REVIEW ON HSEQ'S PROGRESS AND HAPPENINGS.

Q2 & Q3 in the HSEQ Department have been busy months.

In September we had our ISO re-certification audit and our ISM DOC annual audit with Bureau Veritas and again passed with no non-conformities.

We are continuing to work with Experion towards the launch of our Learning Management System. System development is close to completion with Experion and within Stanford Marine all departments are working on the system content..

One of our recent HSEQ highlights was our annual ISM Table Top drill. This was our most successful drill to date with our Safety Captain running a DP Failure Drill from onboard the Stanford Bateleur. This really challenged our shore team to deal with a variety of issues and was a great learning and team building experience.

In recent months we have spent time updating and expanding several areas of our Safety Management System. Most recently we have expanded our Towing and Anchor Handling procedures into separate manuals.

This is part of our overall plans to revamp our management systems. We have been operating our current version since 2011 and while it has been regularly amended we are now working on a full review which will fully integrate recent changes. The aim is to increase the user friendliness and to create a system that encompasses up to date safe systems of work for our staff.

In Q2 & Q3 the HSEQ department filmed and prepared vessel specific passenger safety videos for the Stanford Bateleur & Stanford Mustang. These videos are designed to ensure that our vessels are a safe place for our passengers and crew at all times.

DIWALI


